As students enter the Safari Canyon open-air theater, they discover video displays built into the naturalistic rocks and trees. Before the show, everyone can enjoy guessing wildlife trivia and discovering interesting fast facts about the natural world.



Planet Predator itself introduces students to a diverse selection of the world's meat-eaters and the ways they keep our natural world in balance.

These rare animals exhibit natural behaviors just a few steps away. Then the show's hosts further illustrate the lives of these extraordinary creatures through the use of quick wildlife clips and close up views on the live cam.
